GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION**

HAVE A QUESTION?

To clarify any questions and/or concerns pertaining to the Cantiague School, please call the Principal's office at (516) 203-3650.

LINES OF COMMUNICATION

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's education, use the following steps as a guide:

1. Call, write or email your child's teacher.
2. Make an appointment for a conference with your child's teacher.
3. If further clarification is necessary, please contact the building principal. All calls directed to the principal are maintained in a telephone log.
4. If you are still concerned, consult the appropriate Assistant to the Superintendent of Jericho Schools and then the Superintendent.
5. As a last step, you may contact the Board of Education.

Please note that PTA meetings and monthly School Board meetings provide a forum to discuss general school concerns and programming. These meetings typically include a time for the public to be heard. However, this is not the appropriate forum for individual problems.

STATEMENT OF RIGHTS

Parents and eligible students have the following rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. These include the right to:

1. Be informed about the eligible student's rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.
2. Inspect and review the eligible student's educational records.
3. Exercise a limited control over other people's access to the eligible student's educational records.
4. Seek to correct the eligible student's educational record, in hearing if necessary.
5. Report violations of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

PERMANENT RECORD

Permanent records may be reviewed by parents or guardians at any time by making an appointment. The record includes:

1. Registration information.
2. Copies of all report cards.
3. All standardized test results.
4. Information pertaining to all special education.

CHILDREN'S RESPONSIBILITIES

One of the primary objectives of elementary school is to help children develop independence as they acquire worthwhile work habits. You can help the school achieve this objective by seeing that your child comes to school prepared for the day. Lunch or lunch money, gym attire, sneakers, textbooks, homework, notebooks, musical instruments, etc., are all part of the day's preparation. Please do not bring these items to school for your child. Children should not bring money (except nominal amounts for lunch or PTA sales) and valuables such as jewelry, watches, and electronic devices, including IPODs or CELL PHONES. Additionally, children are not permitted to use the office telephone for personal calls unless there is an emergency. Please do not call the office to ask that messages be given to children because this interrupts the instructional day.

ELECTRONIC "PAPERLESS" COMMUNICATION

The Jericho School District maintains email addresses as part of its ongoing goal of sending all school and PTA information electronically. It is important to keep this information up-to-date, and to check email daily for important notices and information about school events. Please contact Mark Steinberger, (516) 203-3600 ext. 3413 or msteinberger@jerichoschools.org, to update your email account information.

SCHOOL MAILINGS

If you are not receiving United States Postal Service mailings from the Jericho School District, contact the office of Dr. Ben Ciuffo, (516) 203-3600 ext. 3203 or bciuffo@jerichoschools.org.

CONTACTING TEACHERS

You can reach your child's teacher by sending a note in to school with your child, calling the school and leaving a message, or sending an email message. Your child's teacher shall make his or her best effort to return your call promptly. Teachers should not be called from the classroom to answer phone calls, as it interrupts the instructional program.

ARRIVAL OF CHILDREN

In order to provide for the supervision of all children, students should not arrive at school earlier than 8:15 AM. School hours are from 8:25 AM - 2:55 PM. Following are procedures for student arrival:

Buses: In the morning, the buses will pull into the bus area and continue along the curb in front of the school. When the teacher(s) on duty signal, the children will exit the buses and utilize the Main Lobby doors and Exit 8 (next to the Health Office) to enter the building. **Aides will meet kindergarten children by the doors and escort them to their classrooms.** Please note, for the first few days of school, all students are escorted off the buses.

Walkers: Students who walk to school will enter the Niagra Drive gate and enter the building through the Cafeteria entrance when the bell rings. The students in grades one (1) through five (5) will proceed directly to their rooms. **Kindergarten students should be left with the aide(s) in the Cafeteria.**

Cars: Upon arrival, cars should proceed through the designated lane to the walker loop and drop students at Exit 3 (Cafeteria). After drop off of your child, please move your car promptly out of the walker loop out to Cantiague Rock Road. **Please be aware that cars and buses may be entering and exiting the driveway at the same time. Caution is necessary when making left turns onto Cantiague Rock Road.**

DISMISSAL OF CHILDREN

Buses: Students who take the bus will leave through Exits 7 and 8 (near the Health Office and Music Room). Students should proceed to their designated bus or bus line if the bus has not yet arrived. In the event of inclement weather, students will line up in the gym and auditorium and proceed to the buses through Exits 7 and 8 and the Main Lobby doors. Please note that it is the parent's responsibility to arrange for someone to meet your child at your child's bus stop. Arrangements should be made for someone to meet your child if you are not available.

Walkers: Students who are walkers will be the first group dismissed. Students who walk home will leave the building through the Cafeteria doors and walk through the gate to Niagra Drive. Parents who are meeting their children to walk home should wait in the Cafeteria or outdoors near the cafeteria. Please do not go directly to the classrooms.

Cars: All children who are being picked up by car will be dismissed from Exits 2 and 3 next to the cafeteria. Students will be escorted to this area. Parents who are waiting for children are asked to stop their cars in the walker loop in a designated lane behind the gate and turn off their engines. Kindergarten and first grade students should meet their parent at Exit 3. Parents of kindergarten and first grade students should let the aides know that they are taking their child. Students in grades two through five may meet parents at Exit 2 or at their cars. In the interest of safety, all cars must be stopped with engines off while the children are leaving. All parents are requested to return to their cars as soon as their children exit the building.

Please note: All cars in the walker loop must be removed immediately after arrival or dismissal. Please do not leave your car in this area, except to meet a child at Exit 2 or 3.

PLAYDATES

Please be aware that play date requests will be accommodated beginning Monday, September 14th for grades 1 through 5. Play date notes (grades 1-5) must be sent with your child in the morning. Faxed notes or verbal messages will not be accommodated in the interest of student safety. In addition, especially for children in the younger grades, please remind your child that the playdate note is in their bag and please send the note on a larger piece of paper (and not one the size of a post-it note) so that your child will remember to hand it in to their teacher. **NO BUS KINDERGARTEN PLAYDATES will take place this year. Beginning on November 9th, kindergarten students may have play dates by pick-up (walker) only.**

TRAFFIC

New York State law prohibits passing a stopped school bus with flashing lights. Passing a school bus can endanger our children. Please do not enter the traffic loop in front of the school while buses are parked. If you arrive during dismissal, please park your car and enter the building or wait until the buses have left the loop and then pull next to the curb. Parents can also utilize the Niagra Drive entrance to school or the walker loop. Please meet your child by the cafeteria doors (Exits 2 and 3) for Niagra Drive Dismissal.

TRANSPORTATION

Our transportation office is under the direction of Mr. Michael Cotsonas. For information regarding buses, items left on buses and any other transportation concerns, please contact his office at (516) 203-3600 ext. 3244/3245 or mcotsonas@jerichoschools.org. If you do not receive an answer, please contact (516) 206-3600 and dial the operator.

BUS SAFETY

To enjoy the privilege of transportation to and from school, and to provide a safe ride for all, students are expected to observe the regulations. Students who do not follow the rules or directives of the drivers and other staff in authority may be subject to disciplinary actions by the building principal and/or the staff members on duty.

BICYCLE RIDERS

Bicycle racks are provided near the building by Niagra Drive. Jericho School Board policy does not permit bicycles to be ridden on school grounds. It is recommended that bicycles be chain locked to the rack. The school assumes no responsibility for losses. Students who ride their bicycles to school should be instructed by their parents or guardians about safety procedures and traffic laws. All students are required to wear helmets under New York State law.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS-SNOW/EMERGENCY

Arrangements have been made to notify the general public by posting information on the Jericho School District website, www.jerichoschools.org, and by radio and television whenever schools are to be closed because of weather or emergency conditions. The announcements will be broadcast over radio station WINS (1010 on your radio dial). In addition, the following stations will also broadcast school closings: WBLI, WLIX, WHLI, Neighborhood News 12, WCBS and WALK. **Our PTA phone chain will only be activated in case of emergencies and NOT for weather related closings.**

DELAYED OPENING OF SCHOOL

Delayed opening of school due to inclement weather or emergency will be posted on the Jericho School District website, www.jerichoschools.org, and announced on the radio and television in the same manner as school closings. A delayed opening of school is usually a delay of one to two hours. By way of example, if school is delayed for one hour, and your child's bus normally stops for your child at 7:55 AM, the bus would instead be scheduled to stop at 8:55 AM. Dismissal time shall remain the same. **As with school closings, our PTA phone chain will only be activated in case of emergencies and NOT for weather related delays.**

VISITING THE SCHOOL

Signs have been posted throughout the building reminding all parents and visitors to report to the Main Office. When visitors arrive, they are asked to wear a "Visitor" badge at all times while in the building. In this way, the school personnel have knowledge about any person who is in the building and the nature of the visit. The doors of the school are locked after student arrival. Please ring the front bell when visiting and someone will gladly let you into the school. No matter what the nature of the visit, please come to the Main Office before going through the school. If it is necessary to speak with your child or pick him up during recess, please follow regular release procedures. For the safety of all, adults may not go directly to the playground or cafeteria.

REQUESTS FOR EARLY DISMISSAL

It is recommended that dental, medical and other appointments be made at times other than school hours so that children do not miss instructional time. Early dismissals should be kept to a minimum in order to provide continuity of instruction.

RELEASING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL

Our school always endeavors to provide for the safety and security of our children. Therefore, no child is released from school unless a parent, or an individual designated by the parent, comes for a child. A note giving release information, including the time, and who will come for your child should be sent to the teacher in the morning. When you arrive, please proceed to the main office. Your child will be called from the classroom after being signed out. Children will not be released unescorted by a designated adult and are not permitted to go home alone in taxi cabs. Please indicate as an emergency contact any neighbor who has your permission to take your children off the bus and watch them in the event you are not home when the bus arrives or if there is an emergency. **Faxed notes or verbal messages will not be accommodated in the interest of student safety.**

SCOPE PROJECT SAFE TIME

Supervised after-school child care for children in grades K-5 from 2:55 PM until 6:00 PM is conducted by SCOPE on days when school is in session. Further information about this program will be forwarded to parents from SCOPE.

ABSENCES

Parents are reminded to call the office of Joan Gulamerian, the school nurse, at (516) 203-3600, ext. 7485 and report an absence. An answering machine is available at this extension so that you can report an absence 24 hours a day. In addition, a note explaining the absence is required on the day the child returns to school. This note should indicate the specific illness rather than merely state that your child was ill. During school hours, please call the school nurse's office at the extension noted above.

SCHOOLWORK FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE ABSENT

Teachers need some advance notice if you want homework for your child. Please call the office in the morning to notify the teacher. The work should be ready by dismissal. At your option, it may be brought home by another student or picked up in the office.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Please help avoid major outbreaks. If your child is diagnosed as having a communicable disease, (strep throat, chicken pox, pediculosis, etc.), please call the office of Joan Gulamerian, the school nurse, at (516) 203-3600, ext. 7485. This will enable Mrs. Gulimarian to alert the parents of the other children in your child's class to be aware of particular symptoms. Please be assured that the notice will not contain your child's name.

MEDICATION

The New York State Bureau of Health Services does not permit school nurses to administer medication without a written request by a physician detailing the child's name, the prescribed medication, dosage and frequency. This includes over-the-counter and prescription medication. The medication to be administered should be brought by the parent or designated adult to the health office in the original container. Medication may not be carried by students in school. Written permission is also required by the parent. There is a form in the health office for authorization of medication. In the alternative, your physician may fax the written request to the main office at fax number (516) 681-0341.

CRUTCHES AND CASTS

Any child requiring casts or crutches must report to the nurse's office and be accompanied by an adult with a physician's note detailing the diagnosis and duration of need. The use of crutches is not permitted in school. Arrangements will be made for transportation with a wheelchair and use of the elevator. Children with casts or crutches need a doctor's note to excuse them from physical education and active recess. It is suggested that the note include the duration of excuse.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION EXCUSAL

Students who are to be excused from gym for more than two (2) classes require a physician's written excuse. On these days, students will also not participate in recess. In order to resume physical education classes, written permission from the physician is required.

CHILDREN'S LUNCHES

The cafeteria will be open starting the first full day of school, **THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 3rd**. A complete meal, including milk, costs \$2.50. The cost of milk alone is 40¢ for chocolate, regular (whole) or skim. Children pay for their lunches daily, or in the alternative, full and half year pay plans are available through the cafeteria office. Lunch hours are as follows: 11:40 AM for children in grades K, 2 and 4 and 12:20 PM for children in grades 1, 3 and 5. If your child borrows money to pay for lunch, you will be notified by letter at the end of each month.

The PTA will sponsor a Pizza Lunch for Kindergarteners on October 2nd. Kindergarten children will not be able to purchase hot lunch through the Cafeteria until October 9th.

HEALTHY FOODS POLICY

The Jericho School District continues to implement policies to provide our children with the healthiest food choices as possible. In the 2008-2009 school year, Cantiague ran a pilot program providing healthier lunch choices for our children. Seaman Elementary ran a pilot program providing healthier snack choices at their snack window. Please keep healthy choices in mind if you choose to send lunch to school with your child. Please do not purchase pizza or fast food lunches and deliver them to school for your child.

SNACK POLICY

Class parents will be asked to purchase healthy snacks and limit the amount of sugar snacks that are distributed at class parties. For birthdays, we ask that parents send one treat to school rather than multiple treats. When you are planning special visits to the classroom (such as secret reader), please do not include a food treat. Instead, a craft or a game is requested.

BIRTHDAY PARTIES

For birthdays, we ask that parents send one treat to school rather than multiple treats. When choosing a treat to send in for birthday celebrations, please consider that that cupcakes or munchkins are preferred by the teachers. If you wish to send in a sheet cake or a cookie cake, please send it in pre-cut, as the teachers do not necessarily have the tools in the classroom to cut these treats, and, in addition, cutting cakes or cookie cakes takes time away from valuable learning in the classroom.

PTA FOOD SALES

During the course of the year, the PTA or Fifth Grade Fundraising may operate various food sales during lunch hour. Please watch for notices regarding these and other sales.

CANTIAGUE PTA

For parents interested in participating in PTA events please contact the chair of the specific committee that interests you. In addition, please feel free to contact any Executive Committee member at any time regarding any PTA issue. Attached to this Handbook is a list that contains contact information for the entire Executive Committee and for each standing Committee. Please join us! We need your participation and support.

COMPACT FOR LEARNING COMMITTEE

The Compact for Learning Committee is a state-mandated program where each school creates a site-based management team comprised of parents, students, teachers and administrators. The purpose of this team is to participate in shared decision making with the hope of improving education opportunities and performance of all students and promoting collaboration among the participants in the educational process. Accordingly, our school has a Compact Committee that meets monthly.

SEPTA (Special Education Parent-Teacher Association)

The Jericho SEPTA organization is a district-wide association. If you are interested in obtaining information about this association please contact Lisa Landsberg or Dorothy Bauman.

JERICO PTA JOINT COUNCIL

The Jericho PTA Joint Council, organized under the authority of the New York State PTA, is a group of representatives of all of the local Jericho PTA units. Its objectives include providing information and training, to coordinate the efforts of the local units, and encouraging and supporting attendance at district and state conferences and workshops. The Council, whose officers are the presidents and other delegates of their respective units, meets regularly with our Superintendent and other school staff to discuss areas of interest and concern to the Jericho School District. Open meetings take place on Mondays at the Middle School/High School auditorium 5-6 times per year. Please check the calendar for specific dates. Your participation is welcome and appreciated.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

The five elected members of the Jericho Board of Education, all of whom serve without salary are: William Ferro, Shawn Gladstone, Claire Hochheiser, Barbara Krieger (President) and Joseph Lorintz (Vice-President). Usually, Board of Education meetings are held on Thursdays each month (except holidays) and begin at 7:30 PM. However, there are times when meetings are held on alternate times and days. Please check your calendar, email and the district website, www.jerichoschools.org, for the most updated times and dates. The Board welcomes the public to attend Board meetings which often feature presentations of educational programs and activities. The Board of Education may be contacted by email at boe@jerichoschools.org. In addition to the monthly meetings, some of the budget meetings are also open to the public.

CULTURAL ARTS PROGRAM

A Thursday afternoon Cultural Arts Program offers a series of workshops for resident children, K through grade 5, from 3:25-5:10 PM. Cantiague children may attend the workshops at Cantiague Elementary School for either one or two sessions. Transportation to the second workshop session and transportation home from the program must be provided by parents. Additional information about the program will be sent to you directly from the program director, Mrs. Beth Weissman.

SWIM PROGRAM

INFORMATON ON MEGAN'S LAW

Parents for Megan's Law (PFML), an organization funded by the county, state and federal governments, provides community level support regarding sex offender notification. A Sex Offender Email Alert Program has been developed in connection with PFML. Each time a moderate or high-risk sex offender relocates into the area, PFML will place that information, including a photograph, on their website at www.parentsformeganslaw.com. After signing up for the program, subscribers receive email alerts informing them of the offender's name, date of birth, zip code, and a link to the page on the website where the entire notification can be viewed. Individuals who do not have internet access can contact the PFML Helpline at (631) 689-2672 for additional instructions.

Please note at this time PFML is only notified of offenders residing within the Nassau and Suffolk County Police Department's jurisdictions. PFML does not receive notifications from within all local municipal police departments.
