In Jericho High School's class of 2017, 99.9% of all seniors earned Regents diplomas and 93% received Regents Diplomas Awarded with Distinction. Also, 91% of our graduates completed at least one Advanced Placement course. Jericho's percentages in these categories are among the highest in New York State.

BOE Adopts Budget With 0% Tax Levy Increase

Jericho's Board of Education unanimously adopted the proposed 2018-2019 school district budget at an open meeting on March 28, 2018. The \$122,653,735 budget represents a 0% tax levy increase, which is below the New York State Tax Cap. This is the fourth year in a row that the tax levy has remained the same in Jericho.

Since January, the school district hosted a series of public workshops to review the financial status of the school district and create a budget for the coming year. The Board of Education and district administration requested input from members of the school community.

Voting on the budget will be on Tuesday, May 15. If the budget is not approved by residents with a simple majority, the district can resubmit the original budget or a revised budget in June. On the Ballot

Also on the ballot is Proposition #2. This proposition will not have any additional financial impact on the taxpayers. The District is embarking on the third phase of the Capital Improvement Plan. Proposition #2 would authorize the Board to spend \$16.2 million from the pre-existing Capital Reserves and fund balance to implement the thirdphase projects from the Capital Facilities Plan. The bulk of this portion of the plan will include funds to provide cooling to all instructional spaces at the three elementary schools, as well as the Sam Springer Gym and Field House at the HS/MS complex.

Maintaining Programs

While preparing the budget, many strategies were considered, including keeping a multiyear perspective. All instructional programs will continue for next year, and there will also be enhancements to some of these programs.

When adopting the budget, the Board also considered the district's plan to continue technology replacement and expand technological initiatives districtwide.

Included in the budget are plans to add over 765 Chromebooks and 342 iPads. The district will also replace over 290 desktops and 100 laptop computers; replace projectors, Smartboards and printers as needed; and increase network speed, reliability, and storage.

Board of Education Seats

There are two open seats on the Board of Education this year. William Ferro and Daborah Lee are both running unopposed for re-election.

Proposition #2

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

SHALL the Board of Education be authorized to expend a sum not to exceed \$16,125,134 as follows (1) \$783,337 plus additional earned interest 11/30/17 from the capital reserve fund established on May 19, 2015 and (2) \$10,007,400 plus additional earned interest after 11/30/17 from the capital reserve fund established on May 16, 2017 and (3) \$5,334,397 from fund balance for the purpose of completing capital improvements as follows: Districtwide replacement of rooftop exhaust fans; District-wide electrical upgrades and replacement; replace classroom casework and unit ventilators with heating and cooling unit ventilators at Jackson Cantiague and

Elementary Schools: replace classroom casework, replace VAT flooring with VCT, and install new cooling rooftop units to provide air conditioning to Seaman Elementary School; replace existing burners at Jackson Elementary School; remove existing H&V units and furnish and install new HVAC units at the field house and Sam Springer gym, continue to replace ceiling lighting, complete renovation of existing courtyard outside the research center, renovation of existing pool to include concrete repairs and replace deck, gutter, and pool shell tile at the High/Middle School; all of the above to include all labor, materials, equipment, apparatus, and incidental costs associated therewith.



CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

In addition to the proposition, funds are allocated in the proposed budget (\$2,135,000) to upgrade the district-wide electrical systems.

Voting Qualifications

Only persons who are qualified voters as of May 15, 2018 shall be permitted to vote in the election held on May 15, 2018 on matters affecting the Jericho School District and the Jericho Public Library.

A qualified voter is defined as:

- *A citizen of the United States
- *At least eighteen years of age
- *A resident in the Jericho Union Free School District for thirty days or more preceding the budget vote at which he/she offers to vote.

Persons disqualified from voting under the provisions of Section 5-106 of the Election Law are not eligible to vote in school district elections.

New voters may register and vote on the day of the election. They will be asked to provide proof of residency and age.
